Economic Impact	Updated Fiscal Year 2015
The University of Pennsylvania and Penn Medicine contribute \$14.3 billion yearly, or \$39 million per day, to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and \$10.8 billion, or \$30 million per day, to the City of Philadelphia through salaries, purchases, research, construction projects, taxes, and indirect and induced expenditures. Directly and indirectly, Penn generates 90,400 jobs statewide, resulting in \$6.4 billion in wages and salaries and \$181 million in state taxes. Penn's direct capital investments including third party development were \$932 million fostering 10,300 construction related jobs earning a total of \$544 million in construction related wages.
