

LOUISE B. RUSSELL

Louise Russell is Research Professor in the Institute for Health, Health Care Policy, and Aging Research, and Professor in the Department of Economics, Rutgers University. An elected member of the Institute of Medicine, Dr. Russell has served on the IOM's National Cancer Policy Board (2001-2005) and other IOM committees.

Dr. Russell co-chaired the U.S. Public Health Service Panel on Cost-Effectiveness in Health and Medicine, which published recommendations for improving the quality and comparability of cost-effectiveness studies in a book (Cost-Effectiveness in Health and Medicine, Oxford University Press, 1996) and three articles in *The Journal of the American Medical Association* (October 1996). She was a member of the first U.S. Preventive Services Task Force (1984-88).

She has published numerous articles and seven books, including Educated Guesses: Making Policy About Medical Screening Tests (University of California, 1994), Medicare's New Hospital Payment System: Is It Working? (Brookings, 1989), Is Prevention Better than Cure? (Brookings, 1986), and Technology in Hospitals: Medical Advances and Their Diffusion (Brookings, 1979).
